Be It Proclaimed:

Whereas, general aviation and community airports play a critical role in the lives of our citizens, as well as in the operation of our businesses and farms; and,

Expersels, the state of Ohio has a significant interest in the continued vitality of general aviation, aerospace, aircraft manufacturing, educational institutions, aviation organizations, community airports, and airport operators; and,

Whereas, according to the 2014 Ohio Airports Economic Impact Study, general aviation airports in Ohio support 17,497 jobs and \$688 million in annual payroll, and fractional aircraft companies, including NetJets, MaxFlight, and Flight Options employ more than 1,400 Ohio workers; and,

Experses, according to the Ohio Department of Transportation, Office of Aviation, Ohio has a total of 150 public-use general aviation airports and according to the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA), these airports serve 15,586 pilots and 6,319 active general aviation aircraft; and,

Whereas, according to the 2014 Ohio Airports Economic Impact Study, general aviation airports in Ohio contribute more than \$1.8 billion to the state's economy; and,

Experses, according to FAA data, Ohio is home to 137 repair stations, 19 FAA-approved pilot schools, 2,856 student pilots, 2,981 flight instructors, and 122 fixed-base operator, and Helicopter Association International data states that there are 740 heliports in Ohio; and,

Expersely, many communities in Ohio depend heavily on general aviation and community airports for the continued flow of commerce, tourists, and visitors to our state;
