PROCLAMATION
General Aviation Appreciation Month 2016

WHEREAS, the City of Waukesha in the State of Wisconsin has a significant interest in the continued vitality of general aviation, aircraft manufacturing, aviation educational institutions, aviation organizations and community airports; and

WHEREAS, general aviation and the Waukesha County Airport have an immense economic impact on the City of Waukesha; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin is home to 119 public-use airports, which serve 9,278 pilots and 4,485 active general aviation aircraft; and

WHEREAS, Wisconsin is home to 85 fixed-base operators, 48 repair stations, 574 heliports, 7 FAA-approved pilot schools, 1,587 flight students and 1,577 flight instructors; and

WHEREAS, general aviation airports in Wisconsin contributes over \$694 million to the state's annual economic impact; and

WHEREAS; "The World's Greatest Aviation Celebration" will take place in Wisconsin on July 25-31, 2016, as people from across the world converge to take part in the Experimental Aircraft Association's "AirVenture Oshkosh;"


